

Reading Reflection So That You May Believe

It is not often that the author of one of the books of the Bible comes right out and tells us directly why he is writing what he is writing. In this Sunday's Gospel reading, taken from the conclusion of John's Gospel, the author tells us that he has chosen to record these events so "that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name" (20:31).

The letter of John echoes this idea by saying that "[e] veryone who believes that Jesus is the Christ is begotten by God" (5:1)—what we might refer to as being "born again." Our reading from the Acts of the Apostles for this Second Sunday of Easter shows us exactly what it looks like when believers are born again through faith. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co., Inc.

Reflection: Forgiveness...it takes some of us a long time to exercise this trait; however forgiveness for some, is almost like joy. When we give a gift to a loved one, think of the joy we feel as they open it! We can feel this same joy when we forgive... because it's a wonderful gift. Forgiveness is cleansing to the soul/spirit as well, and we are no longer weighed down by resentment, fear, and anger when we forgive. When we are low, we must look for the signs; sometimes subtle that Jesus is reaching out to us...it can be a phone call from a friend or just a moment of a genuine smile from a stranger. Christ is all around us; we just need to get accustomed to seeing him through others and

<u>Reflection Question:</u> How do I experience the peace and forgiveness of Jesus in the Church today? Sometimes when I hide behind the locked doors of doubt, fear, or anger, Jesus makes his presence known to me. What are some of the ways he does

Faith Response: My mind, eyes, and spirit will always be open to the signs of Christ reaching out to me to continue to forgive, and rise above my fears.



Scapular of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel

There is a tradition—which may not be historical—that Mary appeared to Saint Simon Stock, a leader of the Carmelites, and gave him a scapular, telling him to promote devotion to it. The scapular is a modified version of Mary's own garment. It symbolizes her special protection and calls the wearers to consecrate themselves to her in a special way. The scapular reminds us of the gospel's call to prayer and penance—a call that Mary models in a splendid way.
