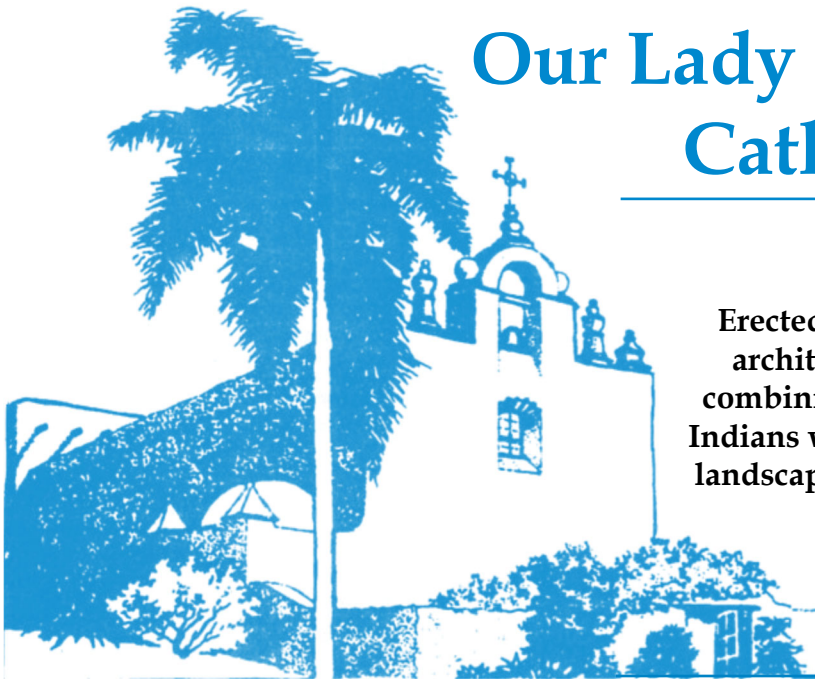




Our Lady of Mount Carmel Catholic Church

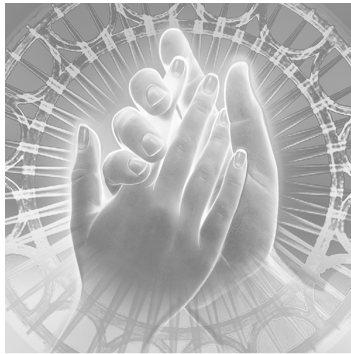

Gospel of Mark 10:2-16

Reflection: Jesus continually protects the vulnerable. Even in regard to marriage. In Jesus' day, women were mainly used to marry into families of good standing, with money and status; many times to promote an alliance between two families. When a husband left his wife, the wife was very vulnerable being a single woman living on her own with no income or status remaining. Jesus did not approve marriage as a casual arrangement, casually arranged for convenience and casually broken. He wanted the church to support marriage and foster healthy marriage. He also blesses those who are vulnerable and open to exploitation. So the children who wanted to be near Him He welcomed and blessed with open arms. His protection on the most vulnerable children is consistent and empowering.



Reflective Question: How can I protect the most vulnerable in my community? What can I do this week to make life easier for someone with less than I?

Faith Response: This is the week that I look at the children and the vulnerable families who need me and I take action, even the most simple gesture, I will take action!

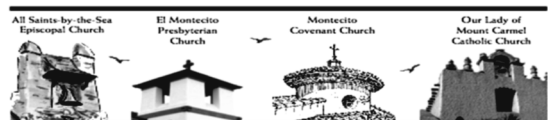
