



Gospel Mark 9:2~10



Reflection: This second Sunday of Lent gospel reading is the Transfiguration account of Jesus, Moses, and Elijah meeting while witnessed by Peter, James, and John. What a moment to be present! Peter doesn't know what to say, so he offers to build tents. God casts a shadow over the holy conversation and proclaims, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him." That proclamation wasn't just for Peter, James, and John; it's also for us.



Fast from problems that overwhelm us; feast on prayerful trust


Fast from talking; feast on listening
