

Gospel John 3:14~21



**Reflection**: "God so loved the world that He gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him might not perish but have eternal life." This is probably the most famous quote from the Bible. Our gospel reading this week says so much more though. Our Savior came to give us all life in its fullness if we only dare to accept it and live according His teachings. Yet some people still prefer the darkness to the light. They hide their actions because, deep down, they know their actions are wrong and take away from God's light and love. Lent is the perfect time to let God's light shine through all our actions so that we are worthy of God's sacrifice.

Question: People preferred darkness to light, because their works were evil. What parts of myself do I try to hide from God and others? How can I change my actions and be open to God's mercy and gift of eternal life?

Faith Response: This week I will scrutinize my life and make any changes necessary to feel the light of God's Love in all that I do.

# LENTEN NIGHT OF REFLECTION


Wednesday - March 13th @ 7 pm Guest Speaker - Bishop Albert Bahhtuth

Bishop Albert will share about his vocation, the practice of Lectio Devina, and the Eucharist, with a time of reflection and adoration included.



## From the Principal's Desk.....

Working in a school, it is always fun to talk to the students about what they are "giving up" for Lent. Some talk about how hard it will be to give up sweets or video games while others joke that they wish they could give up vegetables!:)

We spend a majority of our time during Lent talking about giving up things, fasting. However, fasting is just one of the three pillars of Lent. The other two pillars are almsgiving and prayer. I encourage you to take some time as a family to discuss how to give during this Lenten season as well. A powerful way to couple almsgiving with fasting is to set aside what you would have spent on desserts, soda, etc. and discuss as a family a meaningful cause or charity with whom to share a donation. As a school we are once again partnering with the Fr. Virgil Cordano Center, inviting our students to fill coin banks to support those in need in our community.

Thirdly, during Lent we are called to renew our prayer life. Since life is busy, prayer has to be a choice we make each day. One great way to incorporate prayer into our daily lives is to subscribe to a devotional or reflection that is emailed or texted to you each day. There are also great apps like Hallow, Laudate, Blessed Is She, and so many more that can help us focus our prayer during this season.

Why do we do all of this during Lent? One reason is to separate ourselves from the material world to focus on our inner spiritual lives. St. Augustine said that fasting and almsgiving are the "two wings of prayer." May we be lifted up as we prepare our inner lives for Christ's resurrection at Easter.
