Gospel Luke 11:1~13



<u>Reflection:</u> In this Sunday's Gospel we hear Jesus giving the essential version of the Our Father prayer.

"Father, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come.

Give us each day our daily bread and forgive us our sins

for we ourselves forgive everyone in debt to us, and do not subject us to the final test." Jesus tells us that God the Father is the most loving of all fathers. He will open all doors and answer if we knock. He will give us good gifts, forgive us our sins, and not subject us to the final test. In return, we are asked to forgive everyone in debt to us and live our life in imitation of Him.

Question: ""If you then, who are wicked, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him?" What good things has God given me? How do I share God's gifts with others?

<u>Faith Response</u>: I pray the Our Father often and live the words my heart, head, and spirit.

Your BBQ ticket includes a Santa Maria style barbecue meal. There will be alcoholic beverages available for purchase & free games for the kids.





Did you know that St. Elizabeth Ann Seton is the patron saint of Catholic schools and educators and the first American-born saint? To me saints often seem as if they are from another world with gifts too extraordinary to even try to emulate. However, I take heart when I learn about saints like St. Elizabeth Ann Seton because her life is more relatable. She was not a mystic nor did she speak in tongues. She was a wife and mother of five children. She experienced great joys in her life but also grief much like any of us. She was a convert to Catholicism and started the first American religious order for women.

In Catholic schools we remember St. Elizabeth as the founder of the first American parochial school. It is fitting that her feast day is in January, a time of year that we celebrate Catholic Schools Week each year. In Catholic schools our students understand the value of prayer and how to live out their faith by serving others. They learn how to comport themselves and to take on leadership roles. Mount Carmel students are well prepared academically with our graduates participating and succeeding in our area high schools' most rigorous courses and academies.
