Gospel Luke 12: 13-21



Reflection: Today's Gospel of Luke, should remind and teach us all, the relative value of this world's goods and riches. To be in this world and not of it, to collect the necessary items and goods for this world through honest labor, and yet remain detached from them, is an idea that our weak human nature responds to very reluctantly. We could be like the foolish man described, collecting things and possessions of value on this earth, but of no use to us in death. Question: When given free will to choose between worldly possessions or the world of God and eternity, what will be my decision? Faith Response: I will reflect that no man will be excluded from heaven because he lawfully possessed some of this world's wealth. I still have time to stop fighting and building worldly possessions and turn my attention instead to collecting some treasure for heaven.






