Gospel Luke 12: 32-48



Reflection: I will find comfort in His encouragement to not be afraid. God sees us as a "small flock" reminding us of our value to Him. Jesus encourages us to not hoard what we have, but to live and give generously and invest in eternal treasures, with love, compassion, acts of kindness and forgiveness. The message is important in this reading...the abundance of what we collect reflects on who we are, and we must emphasize the Spiritual, not the material in our relationship with God, and others as well.

Question: How can I keep the priority of the Kingdom of God and be better prepared?

<u>Faith Response</u>: Our daily life needs to reflect readiness and anticipation of Gods return. The emphasis of the unexpected nature of His coming must not be lost on us. We need to nurture our faith and support one another by love and compassion.



From the Principal's Desk...

"Christ has no body now but yours. No hands, no feet on earth but yours. Yours are the eyes through which he looks compassion on this world. Yours are the feet with which he walks to do good. Yours are the hands through which he blesses all the world. Yours are the hands, yours are the feet, yours are the eyes, you are his body. Christ has no body now on earth but yours."

This quote attributed to St. Teresa of Avila speaks to me in a special way. Almost twenty-five years ago when I was just starting my teaching career, I worked in the Logan Heights neighborhood in San Diego. I attended the Catholic church just a few blocks from where I lived and worked, Christ the King or Cristo Rey. In front of the church stood a statue of Jesus that had been vandalized years before. However, the parish embraced it in a positive way. The hands of Christ were broken off the statue, so some of these words from St. Teresa were added to a sign and later to plaques. "I have no hands but yours. No tengo manos más que las tuyas." It was always a powerful reminder to me that we are called to be Christ to others: to love, to serve, to bless our world.

I still remember receiving an email from a parent a few years ago thanking me and the classroom teacher for requiring service hours for our middle school students. To complete the middle school community service during the first trimester, her daughter and a friend helped a resident at Gardens on Hope to organize thousands of books to create a community library. In their time together, the girls not only were a big help to this resident, but they connected with her in a special way. This mom spoke about their service as a gift. "The gift is not in the work. There is the spread of goodwill, happy hearts and sometimes a little inspiration." What a beautiful way to think of serving, of being the hands of Christ! Instead of seeing community service as an obligation or another box to be checked, I pray that our students see it as an opportunity to spread goodwill and make hearts happy by being the hands of Christ!

SAFEGUARD OUR CHILDREN Far reaching effects of child abuse

Children who suffer from sexual abuse run a greater risk of negative associated outcomes, not only with their mental health, but also suicidal tendencies, potential future abuse, more cognitive deficits, or lower educational interests and efforts. Abused children also are at higher risk for eating disorders, obesity, early onset of puberty, or chronic health issues. Ultimately, abuse has far-reaching consequences beyond childhood for many victims, and it is critical to act quickly to protect potential victims. It's important to remember that any intervention or supportive response from a
