Whole Community Faith Sharing

Gospel Luke 17:11-19



Reflection: Today's Gospel reflection takes us deep into prejudice of ethnicity and society's outcast as a leper. Samaritans, mixed race people, were generally despised by the Jews. Add to the fact that this one Samaritan who went back to Jesus to thank him for healing was also a leper and it truly makes you think about acceptance and true love of our fellow man.

Question: How many marginalized, social outcast people have I "not seen" or passed by in my lifetime?

<u>Faith Response</u>: This one Samaritan man was completely healed by Jesus. The most important part of this Gospel is that this one man showed grace and gratitude and he was saved to be welcomed into God's Kingdom. This week, I will strive to be as humble as the one spiritually saved Samaritan leper.



SAFEGUARD OUR CHILDREN About the "Take It Down" Act

The federal TAKE IT DOWN Act was recently signed into law. It criminalizes the publication of nonconsensual intimate images, including AI-generated images. Anyone who publishes or threatens to publish such images online can be charged with a crime and prosecuted. Websites are also required to take down nonconsensual intimate images, if a victim asks, within 48 hours of the request.
