

Whole Community Faith Sharing

Gospel John 2: 13-22



Reflection: This Sunday we see a different side of Jesus. Usually we see Jesus sowing the seeds of love and healing people. In this gospel reading Jesus makes a whip out of cords and attacks the money changers, driving them out of the temple grounds. Where does this anger come from? We learn from the Bible that there is something called "righteous anger" that Jesus shows in his actions towards the money changers who are doing an injustice to other people. The other type of anger is "vengeful anger" where we want to punish others who have hurt us. We must be vigilant and discern between these two angers because the first will lead us to God and the latter will be against God's call to love everyone. We are called to treat all people as our "neighbors".

Question: Which type of anger do I see most in my life? Do I guard myself against all vengeance?

Faith Response: This week I will think of what makes me angry and ask the Holy Spirit to help see the will of God and discern how to deal with the situation.

Dear Parishioners.

As we do each year, the Parish Finance Council (Jack Kerns, Nick Weber, Kathy Wilson, David Crooks, Chris Von Der Ahe, and I) would like to update you on the financial health of our parish.

We have good news to share: Our total collections and donations have reached their highest levels in years—thank you for your generosity!

Despite ongoing inflation and rising costs, the parish's expenses remained steady. However, we did experience a small operating deficit, which was covered by our investment income. While this is positive, it's important to note that investment income is not guaranteed and should not be relied upon to cover operating expenses in the future.

Looking ahead, we are forecasting a deficit of \$185,743 for this fiscal year. Your continued support is essential. If each of us can give just a little more each week, together we can make a significant impact in reducing this anticipated shortfall.

Capital Improvements: Restricted parishioner donations and Call-To-Renewal campaign funds are being used for important parish needs, such as maintenance and repairs. You may have noticed the ongoing pew and wood floor refinishing inside the church. Most Call-To-Renewal projects at the church and school are now complete, and our attention will soon turn to improvements in the Parish Hall.
