

Whole Community Faith Sharing

Gospel
Matthew 2:1-12



Reflection: The Gospel today narrates an incredible story filled with Astrologers, a king, conflict, intrigue, gifts, warnings, and a bright star. A great story, but a closer look might reveal a hidden story. The magi set out on a spiritual journey, prompted by the stirrings of their souls, guided by ancient writings and a wondrous star. They were not sure of what they would find, but they were resolute in their intentions to pay homage to the newborn king of the Jews. They found him, and we can imagine that the Isaiah line described them perfectly: "Then you shall be radiant at what you see, your heart shall throb and overflow." One encounter with the Lord and they were never again the same. They couldn't even return the same way; their journey took a different turn.

We, too, are pilgrims on a journey, seeking the One who will make our hearts "throb and overflow." Each time we meet the Lord, we come away changed, our path pointing in a new direction. Without the benefit of stars and messages in dreams, we continue seeking the Lord in likely and unlikely places. We look for him in prayer, in good people, in good deeds, but sometimes he arrives in silence, in distressing disguises, in emptiness. But we have set out on our own journey and must be resolute. There is no turning back, only going ahead, and, as Isaiah puts it. "Then shall you be radian at what you see, your heart shall throb and overflow."

Question: How will I pay homage to Jesus this year? Do any of my resolutions help me deepen my relationship with him?

Faith Response: This week, I will reflect on the Herod in my life, the obstacle that threatens my growth in the Holy Spirit and pray that God will guide me.


