

Easter Sunday (B) • John 20:1-9 or Mark 16:1-7 • March 31, 2024



THROUGH DEATH TO NEW LIFE








Let's pretend you are in Jerusalem, staying in the house with the apostles. You are all very sad because Jesus has died.

Suddenly, you hear a knock on the door. It's Mary Magdalene, Jesus' good friend. Mary is very upset. She can hardly speak. Someone has taken Jesus' body.

With Peter and the other disciple, you race for the place where Jesus is buried. You look inside. You see the place where Jesus was lying, but Jesus is not there. You feel a little scared. Why would someone take him away?

Later that day, Mary Magdalene returns. She is so excited that her eyes sparkle. She has seen the Lord, she tells you. You wonder, how can one come back to life? You remember then — Jesus said he would!



That evening, as you sit together talking, Jesus comes into the room — even though the door is locked. "Peace be with you," Jesus says, and your heart is filled with joy.

Easter is an exciting feast. When we sing "Alleluia," it's like saying, "Praise the Lord! Jesus lives!"

The message of today's gospel is faith. To help your children grow in their faith, play the "Show and Tell and Believe" game with them.

Have each member draw a picture of something that reminds him or her of Easter. It could be a lily or a butterfly or an egg.

Have members take turns showing what they have drawn and explaining why they chose that particular image.

Open your "Show and Tell and Believe" game by reading the Gospel of John 20:24-29.




This is Tommy. Tommy is a doubter. Doubters learn everything the hard way.






In this week's gospel story, Jesus' friends are sad because Jesus had died on the cross. Then suddenly — SURPRISE!

Since today's children are unfamiliar with the image of a shepherd, set aside some time to drive home this week's message.



When we fight among ourselves,


Lord, help us to love.




Fruitful Branches

- You will need magic markers or crayons, two paper plates, paste or glue, and a small piece of yarn or string.

- Decorate the front of the whole plate and the back of the half plate.
- 1 Now glue the outside edges together, facing each other. If you have no glue, you can staple them or punch holes around the edge and string yarn through the holes to "sew" the plate together.




- Now you have a "pocket" for potholders, letters, or recipes. Punch a hole in the top and put a small piece of yarn or string through it for hanging.


