
There are so many different ways to pray and so many things to pray about that we would need many, many pages to write them all down. Each member of the family has his or her own special way to pray for

words of love for God. (Visitors and friends who want the family to pray for them should be invited to add their intentions.)


- Each evening, when the family prays together, you can all pray for the special things that are written on your poster.
